WHY SEWP IN H2020

- significant internal disparities of research and innovation performance in the EU
- some countries have low participation in the EU Framework Programmes because of:
 - insufficient national R&D investments
 - Iack of synergies between national research systems and EU research landscape
 - system learning effects
 - reduced access to international networks
 - problems with information, communication and training



ELIGIBLE COUNTRIES

- Composite Indicator of Research Excellence (publications, top institutions, patents and ERC grants) with a corrective threshold of 70% of the EU average – detailed info <u>here</u> (p 321)
- Low R&I performing (LPC) or Widening countries: 27
 - 15 MS (Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia)
 - 12 AC (Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, North Macedonia, Georgia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Tunisia, Turkey and Ukraine)
- FP7 part IV Capacities (Regions of Knowledge, Research Potential)
- Horizon Europe fixed list of eligible MS in the legal act



WHAT IS TWINNING?

- CSA grant supporting partnership of less performing research institution and at least two internationally leading counterparts in Europe
- Institutional networking to enable transfer of knowledge and skills and exchange of best practice
- Enhancement of quality of research capacities, research profile of the institution and of its staff
- Focus on clearly defined specific field of research that is a priority for Widening institution



*1st call in 2015

Overall call budget - € 66.24 M

Budget per project - € 1 M max.

Project duration – 3 years max.

Specific issues – non-eligible costs: infrastructure and research costs, equipment including consumables

Proposals submitted – 552


Proposals evaluated – 546

Grants – 67

Minimum points needed – 13.5

Overall call budget - € 30 M

Budget per project - € 1 M

Specific issues – ineligible costs (dtto as in 2015 call)

Proposals submitted – 483



3rd call in 2018

Specific issues – ineligible costs (dtto as in 2015 call), NEW: dedicated WP targeting early stage researchers - ESR (MSCA definition) from coordinating institution

Proposals submitted – 460


Proposals evaluated – 456

Grants – 37

Minimum points needed – 14

*4th call in 2019 (from 2020 budget)

Overall call budget - € 69 M
Budget per project - € 0.9 M
Ineligible costs: Infrastructures costs
Proposals submitted - 439
Proposals evaluated - 437
Grants - 77
Minimum points needed - 13
Successful projects per coordinator's country - see slide 13



Call 2020 Specific issues

dedicated WP or task targeting early stage researchers - ESR (MSCA definition) from coordinating institution

dedicated WP or task for improving research management and administration skills; clearly demonstrate added value and impact of the proposal in case that coordinating institution has received Twinning grant in the past

costs for equipment and research costs (consumables) can be accepted up to 10% of the total budget requested

Change in prioritisation of ex aequo proposals (1st subcriterion: proposals from Widening countries not otherwise covered by more highly-ranked proposals



PT - 13 EE, PL - 8 RS - 7 TR – 6 CZ, LT – 4 HU, LV, RO, SK - 3 AM, BG, CY, SI, TN - 2 BA, HR, MK, MT, UA - 1



EC proposed new FP in June 2018 – ambitious € 100 billion research and innovation programme to succeed Horizon 2020


European Parliament and the Council of the EU reached in March and April 2019 a provisional agreement on Horizon Europe (endorsed by EP on 17 April 2019, two days later by the Council

Work programme 2021-22 (including first calls) – preparations have not started yet (the Horizon Europe Shadow Programme Committee for Widening was supposed to meet in March last, due the COVID-19 it was not possible)



Novelties for Widening under Horizon Europe:

- More integrated policy approach and enhanced synergies with European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF), transnational missions, smart specialisation strategies ERA
- Further simplification and harmonisation of rules across funding systems
- Continuation of core widening instruments with some improvements in response to lessons learnt
- Research cost for CSA eligible under widening opening opportunities for integrating smaller research projects into Twinning and ERA Chairs
- More emphasis on developing management capacities
- Full integration of COST under widening, 80% of actions must have significant widening dimension
- Fixed list of eligible countries to host the main beneficiary (EU13 + PT + EL) based on new indicators and internal study
- EU outermost regions fully eligible to host the co-ordinator
- "Advancing Europe" package with a bunch of additional support schemes to boost participation of less research performing countries
